The innovative and creative aspect of the XXIV. Black International Cinema Berlin 2009, is determined by the longevity and international and intercultural diplomacy, from the founding organization Fountainhead® Tanz Theatre, of utilizing art, culture, creativity and media towards improved understanding and cooperation between individuals and societies through the auspices of the annual Black International Cinema Berlin.

Project description

"Since it was founded in 1986, the Black International Cinema Festival in Berlin has developed into one of the most highly regarded film events in Europe. Produced and directed by the Fountainhead® Tanz Theatre, the extravaganza is an interdisciplinary and intercultural celebration of the contribution made by black actors and directors in the world of film.

The focus of the festival is to present works of a cultural, artistic and political nature coinciding with the general social, economic and educational interests of people from Africa. Open to all filmmakers and visitors, the event provides a platform for the impact of cinema from the African Diaspora and people with an interest in intercultural relations.

The Fountainhead® organization is committed to fighting religious, ethnic and gender persecution and seeks to battle discrimination through dialogue and understanding. By using art, theatre, dance, music and seminars, the foundation believes that prejudice against disadvantaged groups can be challenged and stronger links within society can be forged. Visitors will be treated to powerful and thought-provoking examples of cinema from the past and present."

Under the theme "A COMPLEXION CHANGE - International & Intercultural Diplomacy", films from Africa, the African Diaspora and films with an intercultural perspective are the focus.

Approximately 60 productions will be screened, among them cinematic works from Cape Verde, Benin, France, USA, Iran, India, Togo, Senegal, Belgium, Germany, United Kingdom, Colombia, Spain, Nicaragua, Switzerland and Madagascar. In addition, film discussions, performances and seminars will be conducted.
